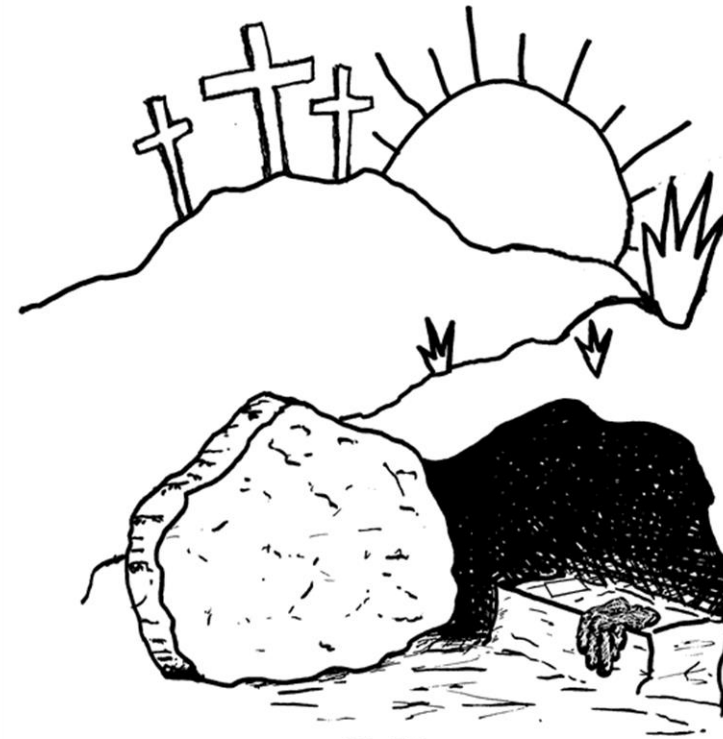

The jazz portion of the concert will feature big band standards, Broadway musical favorites, an American hymn, and more. Come ready to tap your toe and snap your fingers!

The Dordt College Music Department will present an Instrumental Ensembles concert on Friday, May 3, at 7:30 pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium. The Campus-Community Band will start off the concert, performing works by Philip Sparke and Daniel Baldwin, the dramatic Frank Erickson Third Symphony, and Huckleby's "Intrada, Recitative, and Rondo" featuring Dordt trumpet instructor, Kevin Linder. The Concert Band will begin with John Williams' rousing "Liberty Fanfare" and will continue with Phil Sims' "Overture to the Swashbucklers." This will be followed by moving and beautiful works by Dan Forrest and Steve Danyew and close with Daniel Baldwin's jazzy "Capriccio Noir" for piano and wind ensemble, featuring guest artist Tammy Miller.

The Dordt College Choral Concert on Saturday, May 4, at 7:30 pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium will feature Bella Voce (women's chorus), Chorale, and Concert Choir—over 160 singers. The choirs will explore a wide range of repertoire including moving settings of Scriptural passages and worship liturgy; modern arrangements and original pieces by Stephen Hatfield, Eric Whitacre, and Bob Chilcott; a spiritual by Moses Hogan; a Romantic-era story-song by Robert Schumann, and more.
