38 Q. Why did he suffer "under Pontius Pilate" as judge?

A. So that he, though innocent, might be condemned by an earthly judge, and so free us from the severe judgment of God that was to fall on us

39 Q. Is it significant that he was "crucified" instead of dying some other way?

A. Yes. By this I am convinced that he shouldered the curse which lay on me, since death by crucifixion was cursed by God

Welcome to Hope CRC! This morning we continue our series on the book of Acts. This morning’s text is from Acts 4:1-22. As we read the text, we ask ourselves, is the Good News good for us? Or is it a threat? A follower of Jesus is changed. How has Jesus changed and changing our lives? In the evening, we will be reading from Isaiah 53:1-6 and reading from the Heidelberg Catechism, Lord’s Day 15. In this text, we challenged to remember that our gratitude for Jesus’ death and resurrection is something that we are to remember daily in our lives.

This morning, our second offering will be received for the Paradise Bound Ministry. The funds for this offering will be used specifically to offset the costs of the hospitalization and transport of those injured in an accident in Guatemala. Luke Sullivan, mission pilot for Paradise Bound, died of injuries sustained in an airplane crash. The other person in the crash, Bruce Van Fleet, was seriously injured as well, and is currently being treated for his injuries at a hospital in Texas. We pray for comfort for the Sullivan family and the Paradise Bound Ministry as well as for healing for Bruce.
