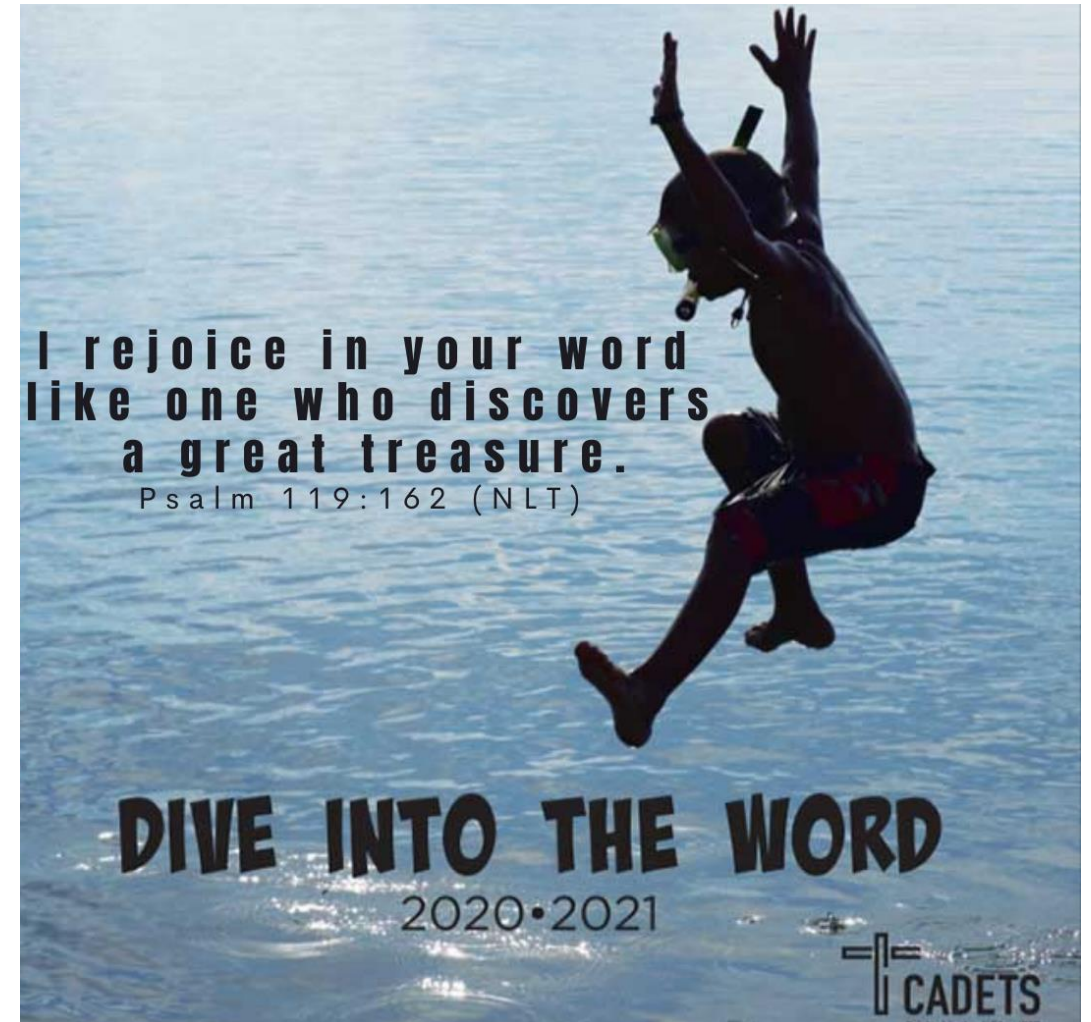

Leo was born in November with part of his esophagus missing and has been in the NICU since his birth. Leo receives nutrition via g-tube until he grows big enough for a surgery to fuse his esophagus using magnets. Greg, Jasmine, and Veda pray that Leo can have surgery in March and hope to be able to bring him home in April.
