WORSHIP NOTES

We welcome you to worship this week. We are glad you are worshipping with us.

This morning we will celebrate the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

In the morning we continue our sermon series called "Romans Pillars", a journey through the book of Romans, as we recognize the foundational truth that Paul shares with the Roman church and us in his letter. We will open to Romans 2:1-16, as we consider our understanding of God's Righteous judgement, in reflecting that he was justified in His wrath for sin we also recognize that His judgements are righteous.

In the evening we invite you to join us as we continue our evening series, looking together at the Sermon on the Mount, the teaching of Jesus that is recorded for us in Mathew, opening God's Word to Matthew 7:15-20. In this portion of the Sermon on the Mount we find Jesus exhorting His listeners and us to be discerning and diligent regarding true and false teachers.

We praise God that He has called us to worship Him in joy and in fellowship!

Declaration

Hear the words of our Lord Jesus Christ concerning the Holy Supper:

Jesus said to his disciples, "I have eagerly desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat of it again until it finds fulfillment in the Kingdom of God" And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it and gave it to them saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper he took the cup saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which was poured out for you."

Thanks

With joy we praise you, gracious God! You created heaven and earth, made us in your image and kept covenant with us-even when we fell into sin. We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, who by his life, death and resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. Therefore, we join our voices with all the saints and angels and the whole creation to proclaim the glory of your name. **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. The heavens and earth are full of your glory!**

Promise

Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

We come in hope, believing that this bread and this cup are a pledge and a foretaste of the feast of love of which we shall partake when His kingdom has fully come. When, with unveiled faces, we shall behold Him and be with Him in glory.

Celebration

This is the table where God intends us to be nourished; this is the time when Christ can make us new. So come, you who hunger and thirst for a deeper faith. Jesus Christ, invites you to be a guest at His table.

The body of Christ was given for you.

Thanks be to God.

The bread that we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.

(pass the elements)

Take and eat. Christ's body was broken for you. Do this in remembrance of him.

The blood of Christ was shed for you.

Thanks be to God.

The cup for which we give thanks is a sharing in the blood of Christ

(pass the elements)

Take and drink. The new covenant is sealed by Christ's blood. Do this in remembrance of him.

Loving God, we thank you that you have fed us in this sacrament, united us with Christ and have given us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet we will share together in your eternal kingdom. Send us out in the power of your Holy Spirit to live and work or your praise and your glory for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, who is our Savior. AMEN
