Congregation- Give us hearts that are gentle and kind to see another in	
their pain and try to understand their hurt and suffering.	
<u>Reader 2</u> - Act with honesty and integrity	
Congregation - Give us wisdom to speak the truth in love, to bring peace in	
hard situations and to make choices that demonstrate in word and deed	
that we are followers of Jesus.	
Reader 2 - Respect others' boundaries	
Congregation - Give us pure thoughts and motives so that in all we do God

<u>Reader 2</u> - Admit and apologize after wronging someone	
Congregation - Give us humility, gentleness and courage to do the right

<u>Reader 2</u> - Advocate for the marginalized and the vulnerable.	
<u>Reader 1</u> - Let us not forget the words of Jesus which remind us that whatever	
we do or do not do to the "least of these"; those who are suffering with pain,
